WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I is supplemental federal funding for low achieving children, especially in high poverty schools. This program provides extra academic support and learning opportunities for children farthest from meeting challenging state standards. Title I helps Greenfield-Central Schools by supplementing and improving the regular education programs offered at Title I schools. The goal is to help students meet the State standards.

HOW DOES A SCHOOL BECOME A TITLE I SCHOOL?

The number of students that qualify for free and/or reduced lunch is used to determine the district-wide poverty and school poverty levels. Title I can serve schools at or above the district-wide poverty average.

WHO IS SERVED BY TITLE I?

In Title I programs, children farthest away from meeting the State standards must be considered first. Services are based on academic needs of individual children, not on the poverty of a child or his/her family. Title I served migrant children, limited English proficient children, children who are homeless, children with disabilities and any child who is in academic need.

WHAT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED BY TITLE 1?

The types of services depend on the school. The types of services are limited only by the imagination and by solid research based programs and practices. Services must support children's ability to master the standards in English/Language Arts and Mathematics.

For example, Title I can provide tutoring, special teachers in reading and/or math, pre-school programs, extended day/year programs, learning laboratories, professional development for teachers and parents, and home-school liaisons.

Title I schools are required to meet state and federal mandates for achievement called Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP). If a school fails to make AYP for two consecutive years, it is placed in Year 1 of Improvement. If the school fails to make AYP the following year, it moves to Year 2 of Improvement. For each consecutive years that a school fails to make AYP, it move to the next level of improvement. A school must make AYP for 2 consecutive years in order to be removed from improvement status.

WHAT IS SCHOOL CHOICE?

School choice allows parents of children who attend a school in improvement to transfer to a school not in improvement. Their child will be allowed to remain at that school through 3rd grade. Transportation to the new school can be provided. Beginning in 2009-10, School Choice was offered to all students in the Harris school district. Parents had the opportunity of enrolling their child in the School Choice options of J. B. Stephens Elementary or Weston Elementary the following school year.

WHAT ARE SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES?

Supplemental Educational Services (SES) are free tutoring services offered to students attending a school that is in improvement. Beginning in the 2009-10 school year, SES was offered to students who attended a school in Year 1 of improvement, who qualify for free or reduced lunch and who are non-proficient in at least one academic area. Parents have at least 2 opportunities per year to enroll their child in Supplemental Educational Services.
