Greenfield-Central Families,

This morning at 10am, the State Department of Health released updated COVID-19 quarantine guidance for schools that becomes effective on February 23rd. We have included a few of the highlights from this update in the following statements:

- Schools should continue to isolate COVID-19 positive individuals for at least 5 days per guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).
- A negative test or doctor's note is no longer required to return to school. Students should not return to school unless they are fever free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.
- The State Department of Health *no longer recommends contact tracing and quarantining* in schools.

As a result of these updates, Greenfield-Central Schools will no longer identify close contacts, and we will not quarantine students who were previously excluded from school simply because they were in a close proximity to a COVID positive student.

Additionally, the current mask mandate for Greenfield-Central Schools will end on Tuesday, February 22nd. *Masks will be optional beginning on Tuesday morning for all students and staff inside our schools.* Please note that masks will still be required on Greenfield-Central school buses at this time. This is still a federal requirement established by the Department of Transportation.

We understand that the last 22 months have included many updates and revisions to the way we operate school during a pandemic. As we receive additional information or guidance from the state or local health departments, we will share that information with our school community in a timely manner. Your cooperation and teamwork in keeping students and staff safe during this unprecedented time in history has been valued and appreciated.
